

During the Vietnam War B Troop suffered quite a few losses due to combat action. Out of all the losses only two bodies were never recovered. The aircraft that WO Mark J. Robertson of Michigan and Sgt. Joseph Pietzrak of Ohio were flying in on 10 FEB 1971 exploded in flight as a result of hostile. They were automatically presumed dead because of the intensity of the explosion and due to the enormous amount of enemy activity, there was no attempt at making any recovery.

Randy McConnell, who is very active in the POW MIA issue, asked to speak at our dinner / meeting in Las Vegas last year. Randy informed us that the remains of both WO Robertson and Sgt. Pietzrak were recovered and repatriated to the United States. We hope that this news can bring some closure to the friends and family of both troopers.

Randy also wanted to relate to us that even with the increased amount of effort being exerted to resolve the POW MIA issue during the past few years, we should press our governmental leaders to apply even more pressure to resolve this issue as quickly and completely as possible.

Finally, I would like to say we are in the initial stages of planning our 2007 reunion, which will be held at Ft. Campbell, KY. Hopefully the Banshees will still be there when we have our gathering and will want to be a part of it. The actual date is not set yet so keep you eyes open for more Gazettes and check our website frequently for further information.



Veteran Benefits

It is recommended that you request copies of your records from the Veterans Affairs Administration. Under the Freedom of Information Act you may receive copies of your records once at no charge to you.

<u>The VA does loose records</u>, so if you request records every 6 months you will have copies in case they do loose something in your file. This is very important for your VA Medical Records exspecially if you have a claim pending or are prefairing to file a claim.

Write or visit Release Of Information Office at your Regional Office and/or Medical Center.
